Project 2- Comfort and Objects- Unit Plan

I. Conceptual Framework

- A) Big Idea: Objects & Meanings
 - 1) Objects with Meaning (social, personal, aesthetic, etc.)
 - 2) Differing personal experience allow for different perspectives or connections with objects
 - 3) Objects have different functions (economic value, social status, and aesthetic value)
- B) Essential Questions:
 - 1) Does everyone view all objects the same?
 - 2) How does someone create a connection with objects?
 - 3) How do objects acquire meaning?
 - 4) How do objects have differing meanings for different people?
 - 5) Are there any hidden meanings in objects?
 - 6) What can you do to change someone's views about a certain object?
- C) Key artistic concepts:

 - Using cold connections to attached non-metal materials
 - Theme: Comfort through family, heritage, material, or inspiration of materials

- From your home bring in 7-10 objects that you find comforting to create a comforting collection.
- Answer the questions in Appendix B at home.

In Class:

- As a class go over the questions completed about objects collected and discuss one object from each classmate.

Address the following Big Idea questions during discussion:

- 1) Does everyone view all objects the same?
- 2) How does someone create a connection with objects?
- 3) How do objects acquire meaning?
- 4) Do the objects shared have different meanings or connections to each of us?
- 5) Are there any hidden meanings in objects?
- Go over Assignment Sheet (see Appendix C)
- Show images/slideshow who use found objects in their work and who might make connections to comforting objects.
