

- What are some ways you can find deeper meaning within inherited objects?


- In what ways does Mah Rana explain the deeper meanings behind her work?

What should you do with these ideas?

- Inherited or family objects
 - Look deeper into the objects to gather more inspiration.

 - Materials that give you comfort, but may not be useful for their intended purpose any longer.
- Using objects as the inspiration
 - Take an aspect of an object and use that as inspiration.
- Consider your senses
 - What types of sights, smells, textures, tastes, and sounds comfort you?
